Results from a National Survey of Accredited Programs

INTRODUCTION AND OVERVIEW

The CACREP Vital Statistics Survey is used for collecting more detailed program information and soliciting feedback from accredited programs on current issues. The survey results are also used by the CACREP Board of Directors and staff to help improve the services provided to accredited programs.

CACREP program liaisons are charged with reporting data on the Vital Statistics Survey each academic year, including the summer, fall, and spring academic terms. The 2022 CACREP Vital Statistics Survey collected program data reflective of July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022. The results are included in this report. These data are used to monitor changes and emerging trends within counselor education programs.

The purpose of this report is to make the results of the 2022 CACREP Vital Statistics Survey available to CACREP-accredited programs, state and federal government agencies, counseling licensure/certification entities, counseling researchers, and other stakeholders within the counseling profession as well as the general public. Data concerning CACREP programs, specialty areas, faculty members, and students are presented along with brief narratives as appropriate. The information in this Vital Statistics Survey results report offers a unique description of currently accredited counselor education programs—as well as the students they serve— which assists in providing an environmental context that is helpful for understanding counselor preparation in 2022.

INSTITUTIONAL INFORMATION

All graduate counseling programs accredited by CACREP before July 2022 completed the 2022 Vital Statistics Survey. As a result, 434 institutions offering a total of 909 CACREP-accredited counseling programs contributed to the data included in this report.

INSTITUTION TYPE

CACREP accredits graduate counseling programs at all types of post-secondary institutions (see FIGURE 1). Using categories set forth by federal guidelines, institutions offering CACREP-accredited counseling programs in 2022 are broken down as follows: Public (n=250), Private not-for-profit (n=175) and Private for-profit (n=9).



INSTITUTIONS BY ACES REGIONS

According to the 2022 Vital Statistics Survey results, CACREP-accredited programs employ 3,260 full-time faculty members and are offered by post-secondary institutions located throughout the United States, as well as Mexico. To present a clearer geographical picture, these institutions are categorized by their location within the regions designated by the Association for Counselor Education and Supervision (ACES) (see TABLE 1). In 2022, the highest concentration of institutions with CACREP-accredited programs was located in the SACES region (n=176); followed by NCACES (n=110), NARACES (n=86), WACES (n=35), RMACES (n=23), and US Territory (n=2).

CACREP PROGRAM AREAS

Clinical Mental Health Counseling was the specialty area with the highest number of CACREPaccredited programs (n=373) in 2022, with School Counseling programs having the second most (n=267).

However, several specialty areas experienced a slight reduction in numbers of programs last year that include Clinical Rehabilitation Counseling (n=2), Counselor Education and Supervision (n=4), Marriage Couple and Family Counseling (n=3), Rehabilitation Counseling (n=7), Student Affairs and College Counseling (n=3) and dually-accredited Clinical Rehabilitation/Clinical Mental Health Counseling (n=3). The largest reduction was for School Counseling, which experienced a decrease of 20 programs.

In terms of graduates in the past year, Clinical Mental Health Counseling programs claimed the most with 12,175 graduates. The Clinical Mental Health Counseling specialty area also claimed the largest number of currently enrolled students (n=49,645) in 2022. Specialty areas reported fewer than 100 students enrolled, as well as less than 100 graduates, in 2022: Career Counseling, Addiction Counseling, and Student Affairs and College Counseling. However, dually-accredited Clinical Rehabilitation/Clinical Mental Health Counseling programs reported 399 graduates last year. TABLE 2 offers further details on the number of accredited programs, student enrollment, and graduates reported by program area.

TABLE 3 sheds light on the number of individuals who applied to CACREP programs in the past year, the number of students who graduated from CACREP programs in the past year, and the total number of students currently enrolled in CACREP programs across the country, per the 2022 survey. Information about total program applicants, graduates, and current student enrollments are broken down by program level (i.e., masters vs. doctoral) and data are provided for the past three years.

NOTE. The aggregate applicant and graduate data for 2022 in TABLE 3 are based on program report and reflect the total number of applications received and total number of students who graduated from programs "in the past year" (e.g., Summer 2021-Spring 2022). Current student enrollment is based on data reported by programs as of the date each program submits the Vital Statistics Survey for a given year.

FACULTY AND STUDENTS

Placing significant value on diversity, CACREP requires counseling programs to create and support an inclusive learning community. The CACREP Standards not only call for programs to recruit, employ, and retain a diverse faculty, they also require programs to make systematic efforts to attract, enroll, and retain a diverse student body. Part of examining diversity within the counseling profession involves taking a close look at the individuals who are becoming professional counselors. Going beyond numbers of applicants, graduates and student enrollments, this final section will provide a detailed demographic perspective regarding the makeup of full-time faculty members and students in CACREP programs.

Racial/ethnic demographic breakdowns are reported for full-time faculty members (TABLE 4), CACREP masters students (TABLE 5), CACREP doctoral students (TABLE 6), and all CACREP graduate students combined (TABLE 7). Lastly, FIGURE 2 illustrates the gender differences among students and full-time faculty members in CACREP-accredited programs followed by FIGURE 3 which highlights information about students with disabilities as reported by programs on the 2022 CACREP Vital Statistics Survey.




